As We Gather

The world has experienced a recession, and not just economically. We are in a recession when it comes to the truth. We have come to a place where people are okay with saying things like, "You have your truth and I have my truth," even when those supposed "truths" are diametrically opposed to one another. Even simple numbers are no longer objective facts, but social symbols of race and class. Where then do we turn for the truth we so desperately need to hear? In anticipation of Pentecost, Jesus spoke of the Holy Spirit's work. He said, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth" (John 16:13). Today we consider the nature of truth and the Spirit's work.
