AS WE GATHER

The Transfiguration of our Lord is like a prism through which we can see the multifaceted glory of Jesus. In it, we see a picture of His unique authority. In it, we get a glimpse of the eternal glory He had veiled. And in it, we're given a preview of what our lives will be like on that final mountain where we will all be transfigured (Matt. 13:43), where His glory will provide all the light we need (Rev. 21:23; 22:4–5), and where He will tabernacle not only with Moses and Elijah but with all of His people (Rev. 21:3). That will be glory indeed, so Peter wants us to always remember these facts.

Collect:

O God, in the glorious transfiguration of Your beloved Son You confirmed the mysteries of the faith by the testimony of Moses and Elijah. In the voice that came from the bright cloud You wonderfully foreshadowed our adoption by grace. Mercifully make us co-heirs with the King in His glory and bring us to the fullness of our inheritance in heaven; through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," ¹⁸ we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain. ¹⁹ And we have the prophetic word more fully confirmed, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts, ²⁰ knowing this first of all, that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. ²¹ For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

Organ Postlude: Fanfare (ref. Psalm 81, vv.1-3) - John Cook (1918-1984)

A musical Fanfare (usually of trumpets) often announces an event of importance. Psalm 81 indicates our exuberance in the worship of God on the Lord's Day. It can easily be applied to our worship today of the Transfigured Christ. This British composition dating from 1952 builds that concept into a cohesive extravaganza of modern harmony and rhythmic vitality featuring our organ's Spanish Trumpet stop in the beginning and ending portions in alternation with a full organ chorus ensemble. The middle section is more subdued, somewhat quirky and dance-like, featuring contrasting colorful stops. Fresh, modern harmonies and angular rhythms permeate throughout, ending with climactic full organ.
