AS WE GATHER

VDMA is an acronym that stands for the Latin slogan: *Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum*, which translated means, "the Word of the Lord remains forever," taken from Isaiah 40:8 and later repeated by the Apostle Peter (1 Peter 1:24-25). The unchanging faithfulness of God to his Word is at the very heart of the gospel. Today, we consider the power of that faithful Word as Jesus speaks words that bring forth faith and lead to further words of healing to bless two very different "daughters."

Collect:

Stir up, O Lord, the wills of Your faithful people that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may by You be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Matthew 9:18-26

¹⁸ While he was saying these things to them, behold, a ruler came in and knelt before him, saying, "My daughter has just died, but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live." ¹⁹ And Jesus rose and followed him, with his disciples. ²⁰ And behold, a woman who had suffered from a discharge of blood for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his garment, ²¹ for she said to herself, "If I only touch his garment, I will be made well." ²² Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." And instantly the woman was made well. ²³ And when Jesus came to the ruler's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, ²⁴ he said, "Go away, for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. ²⁵ But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl arose. ²⁶ And the report of this went through all that district.

Today's Offertory Hymn LSB 786 - The third stanza is a Trinitarian Doxology - denoted with the little triangle - which reminds us to stand during this stanza to acknowledge and glorify our Triune God. We do something special at that moment because we are clearly setting ourselves apart from others who would claim Christianity, but deny the Triune God.
