TENEBRAE

Good Friday is part of the sacred Triduum, the three-day observance of Christ's Passover. Good Friday is not observed as a funeral for Christ. It is a day for repentance over sin and restrained joy and praise for the redemption Christ accomplished for us on the cross. In keeping with this character, music is kept to a minimum, though not silenced. The altar remains bare, having been stripped on Holy Thursday. The service of Tenebrae (meaning "darkness") consists of the extinguishing of the church lights.

- P: O Lord, open my lips.
- C: And my mouth will declare Your praise.
- P: Make haste, O God, to deliver me;
- C: Make haste to help me, O Lord. Praise to You, O Christ, Lamb of our salvation.

Collect for Good Friday

Almighty God, graciously behold this Your family for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed and delivered into the hands of sinful men to suffer death upon the cross; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.


