## As We Gather

God specializes in showing up right in the middle of our mess, and today's reading from Isaiah 7 is proof. King Ahaz was panicking like a man who just realized his warranty had expired, and God said, "Ask for a sign." Ahaz tried to sound humble, but God basically replied, "Fine. I'll give you one anyway—a Virgin will conceive and bear a Son." That's God for you. When we bring fear, He brings promises. When we bring excuses, He brings grace. When we bring nothing, He brings Christ—the Child born of Mary, the Savior who steps into our world with no panic and no hesitation.

Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come and help us by Your might, that the sins which weigh us down may be quickly lifted by Your grace and mercy; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? <sup>14</sup>Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. <sup>15</sup> He shall eat curds and honey when he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. <sup>16</sup> For before the boy knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land whose two kings you dread will be deserted. <sup>17</sup> The LORD will bring upon you and upon your people and upon your father's house such days as have not come since the day that Ephraim departed from Judah—the king of Assyria!"
